
MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a state prisoner, alleges that in three civil proceedings the subject United States Magistrate Judge “refuse[d] to listen to my complaints,” denied “[my] right of access to the court,” “never checked me out by medical in which I have asked in petition after petition for,” refused to “take my pleadings as true,” “denied injunctions” against prison personnel and thereby “left me in imminent danger.” He further complains that the magistrate judge denied his recusal motions. Complainant concludes that he has been denied “fundamental fairness in court” by the magistrate judge’s abuse of judicial power.

These allegations relate directly to the merits of the magistrate judge’s decisions, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
