## MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a *pro se* litigant, complains that the subject United States District Judge's decription of her brief as difficult to understand and digressed from the single order at issue, was erroneous, "insult[ing]," and "disdain[ful]." She further alleges that the judge improperly relied on the bankruptcy record, including appellee's counsel's purportedly intentional mischaracterizations of complainant's conduct, instead of reviewing "my motion for relief and all other court documents." Complainant submits that the judge thereby "ignored the fraud upon the court" perpetrated by appellee's counsel.

The allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's decision, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
