MEMORANDUM


Complainant, a pro se litigant, complains that the subject United States District Judges failed to grant his motions to enter judgment against the defendants in his lawsuits. He urges that their failure to do so constitutes “gross negligence of duty.” He requests that both judges be placed on “permanent disability status” and that they be required to undergo continued legal education.

The complaint relates directly to the merits of the judges’ decisions and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
