## MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant, alleges that the subject United States Magistrate Judge's application of the law in his Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendation was erroneous, "attempted to deny [me] equal protection under the law," and "revealed" the magistrate judge's "absolute incompetence."

To the extent that these allegations relate directly to the merits of decisions or procedural rulings, they are subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, the assertions of intentional denial of equal protection under the law and incompetence appear entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegations are separate, they are wholly unsupported, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) as "lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference of misconduct" or incompetence.

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
