## MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant and former federal prisoner, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by the subject United States District Judge in a pending civil proceeding.

Complainant complains that by denying her motion for a temporary restraining order and unduly delaying ruling on her motions for default judgment and for judgment as a matter of law, the judge "illegally deprived [me] of [my] entitlement to just compensation," and did so in retaliation for complainant's filing a judicial misconduct complaint against another United States District Judge in 2009. She provides no evidence in support of the allegation of retaliatory motive.

To the extent that these allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's decisions or procedural rulings, they are subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, the allegation of retaliatory motive appears entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegation is separate, it is wholly unsupported, and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) as "lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred."

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.
